1. Repayment clauses

Most of our newly arrived members are here on health and social care sponsorship visas. This can leave people very vulnerable to exploitation and create terrible hardship when people are so unhappy that they want to leave their employer. Most migrants in that situation will have signed contracts that include 'repayment clauses' and find themselves faced with huge bills if they try to resign.

If you are struggling in a new workplace where you are not happy and feel unsafe or discriminated, we want to hear from you!

Remember that it is important to raise issues you face in your workplace with your employer as a first step:

- Make sure you raise issues in writing (email or even text / WhatsApp messages)
- If things don't improve raise an official grievance
- Keep a diary / keep a paper trail of trying to address the issues you are having.
