UNISON Health Workers Are Speaking Out and Stepping Out

Recently UNISON NI has announced that thousands of its members have voted to strike and take action short of strike. Our Head of Bargaining, Anne Speed, has said that of the thousands who voted in November more than 97% have voted to take action and action short of strike. We have now organised Action Short of strike beginning on 5th December and a strike day of Monday 12th December. Politicians and employers should now be concerned with putting NHS pay right. Our members know that staff are exiting the services and without urgent movement on pay, many more will follow suit. Health services are in a dire state with too few staff to deliver safe patient care. That's why our NHS members have voted to strike over pay and staffing. We need a wage rise that better reflects the harsh economic reality for working people. Our politicians in N Ireland should be ensuring that funding and resources are delivered. The Executive should be restored and mechanisms in place to make this happen. The cost of living crisis is imposing additional burdens on an workforce. overstretched and undervalued Employers must not stay silent-workers do not easily take to the picket lines but they have no choice.

Free School Meals For All



Free School Meals for All: The free school meals working group, established by Regional Committee, has continued to take forward our campaign calling for universal free school meal provision for all children and young people.

The campaign objectives are:

• to seek universal, nutritious, free schools meals for all pupils to both reduce poverty and improve public health;

• to safeguard and promote the vital work of our members within schools catering. School meals services should be publicly provided;

• as a response to the Covid-19 pandemic, to build support for the implementation of a public health model across Government that is aimed at dealing with health and educational inequalities that have been exacerbated during the pandemic.

UNISON College offer over 700 different course topics to our members each year. Ranging from in person accredited learning to virtual and eLearning CPD modules.

We offer E learning modules through the skills academy and Nursing Times CPD Zone. These are fully funded for all UNISON members.
