THOUSANDS OF UNISON MEMBERS TOOK TO THE PICKET LINE!

OFFICIAL Picket UNISON members sent a very clear message to the Department of Education of our first strike in over a decade. Thousands of UNISON members have decided to stand up and be counted. They have decided they have been waiting too long for a pay and grading review. **They want pay justice.** In 2019

discussions on pay reform were promised. The Covid pandemic stalled movement. Education workers understood that, but efforts to get negotiations going have ground to a halt. Members recognise there is some goodwill in the Education Authority to get this matter sorted but the EA continue to tell us there is no agreed funding to support negotiations. The Department of Education has been sitting on the fence. Where is their voice in support of this just cause? The Northern Ireland Secretary of State, now responsible for the Education budget

should be told in no uncertain terms that asking workers to wait until an Executive and the Assembly returns is just not good enough.





NJC Pay Award 2023/24

The NJC pay uplift (covering NI, England and Wales) due since April 1st 2023 has finally been agreed. We recently updated members on the long delay in resolving this issue. Efforts to improve on the offer were unsuccessful and it has taken some months to confirm that members of the negotiating unions would accept the initial offer.

We have now asked the Education Authority to confirm payment and make all necessary arrangements to ensure education workers are paid without delay. The payments are to be paid in the December payroll including back pay. Our NJC Committee continues negotiations for 2023/24.

Supporting our Members

This year the branch has:

- Provided advice and representation to members facing disciplinaries, experiencing bullying and harassment, or suffering injuries at work;
- Held workplace meetings with members;
- Supported our members with Health and Safety concerns and raised these concerns at the EA quarterly meetings;
- Regularly met with management on a range of issues within schools;
- Attended EA Directive meetings bringing forward the concerns of our members within, catering, transport, classroom assistants and cleaning;
- Represented our members at all Education Authority, voluntary grammars and integrated schools;
- Policies currently being discussed Domestic Violence & Abuse Policy and Menopause Policy.

WORKPLACE VIOLENCE SURVEY

UNISON recently conducted a survey on workplace violence experienced by support staff working in a class-room setting. Out of responses received, 66% report being worried about violent behaviour from pupils, with 57% experiencing or observing violent incidents towards staff on a daily or weekly basis. Respondents reported a lack of support from management and a feeling of normalisation of violence.

UNISON Northern Ireland plans to use these survey findings and feedback to the campaign to make the workplace safer and more sustainable for support staff.
