The Homeless Period Belfast is a volunteer-led campaign, providing care-packs filled with sanitary donations to women in need across Belfast.

Set up in November 2016, we have distributed close to 1000 of our period carepacks to our service users.

Period Poverty Facts:

'Period poverty' refers to having a lack of access to sanitary products due to financial constraints.

The facts:

- 1 in 10 girls aged 14 to 21 cannot afford menstrual products
- 40% of girls in UK have had to use toilet paper because they could not afford sanitary towels and tampons
- There are 68,000 homeless women in the UK
- Many homeless organisations receive funding for male razors but not for menstrual products
- Sanitary items are the least donated item in foodbanks

Statistics challenged...

"Surely anyone can afford a few pounds for a pack of tampons.."

The reality: Even the cheapest of products can be an expense too far for some people.

If rough sleepers and people who depend on foodbanks cannot afford food then the reality is they cannot afford menstrual products either.

Taboo issue?

There are myriad of reasons why people cannot access menstrual products but the stifling taboo that surrounds menstruation is perhaps linked.

It is because of the stigma attached to menstruation that we do not think about it as a problem for people.
